Join CEDARR in Finalizing Drug-Free Grant Application

At the CEDARR meeting in December, coalition members discussed the community assessment and strategic planning for the application for the Drug-Free Communities grant. At that time, Stephanie Soares Pump, a grant writer for CEDARR (Community Efforts Demonstrating the Ability to Rebuild and Restore) on a contract funded by Lincoln County's Drug-Free Communities grant, requested a full day to meet and come up with a strategic plan.

The focus of the grant is to reduce alcohol and other drug use, especially among youth, through community coalition work. This is a five-year grant for \$100,000 per year and most grantees are awarded an additional five years.

"We need your input! This is an opportunity to affect real change in the community for youth. It is possible that we could write in a goal to help get grants in all three area offices in following years, so area office involvement in planning would be very valuable," said Janet Wicklund, Siletz Tribal A&D director.

Pump brings experience in writing these difficult grants as well as directing programs that have received them. Some benefits of this grant can include changes in adult attitudes about underage use; less tolerance and acceptance and more protection for kids; improving knowledge across the greater community about what it takes to raise healthy, safe kids; and meaningful roles for adult and youth volunteers who want to make a difference in their community.

Do you care about your community? Are you convinced it could be healthier and safer for your children? Are you a youth who is tired of peer pressure and friends you see messing up their lives or hurting?

Do you think you can influence parent and other adult behavior? Do you believe that one person can make a difference and many people can move mountains? If you answered yes, "then you need to be involved with CEDARR!" said Pump.

To finalize the strategic plan for the Drug-Free Communities grant application, a planning meeting will be held with staff and CEDARR community members on Jan. 6 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Siletz Tribal Community Center.

"I hope the process I use will engage people and get their creative juices flowing," said Pump.

CEDARR is looking to have strong partnerships with the following 12 community sectors – youth; parents; business community; media; school; youth-serving organizations; law enforcement agencies; religious or fraternal organizations; civic and volunteer groups; health care professionals; state, local or Tribal agencies with experience in the field of substance abuse; and other organizations involved in reducing substance abuse.

Wicklund encourages others to take part too.

"If you work with youth or have expertise that may help us in this process, your attendance would be very helpful," she said.

Firewood Again Available, Likely Only Time Until Spring

The North Fork #2 – South firewood unit once again is open for Tribal member firewood cutting. **Permits are required** and can be obtained at the Tribal Natural Resources office in the Tribal administration building in Siletz from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on weekdays.

Maps and directions also are available at the same location.

Permits will be issued to Tribal members only who will need to show their Tribal ID card and provide the license number of the vehicle they will use to haul the wood. If you live outside of the area you can call the numbers below to have a permit mailed to you.

The permits are for Tribal member woodcutting for **personal use only**. This firewood **cannot be sold**.

The person named on the permit must be present when cutting and hauling the firewood. Tribal members wishing to cut wood for Tribal Elders must present a signed note from the Elder stating that the individual is authorized to cut firewood on their behalf. The note must include the Elder's Tribal ID number.

Permits are good for two weeks and allow up to two cords of wood to be cut on each permit. Each Tribal member is allowed up to five cords total per year from Tribal firewood units.

This likely will be the only firewood area open until spring.

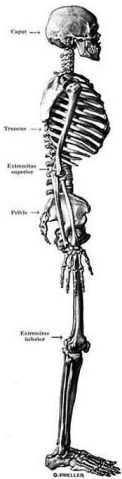
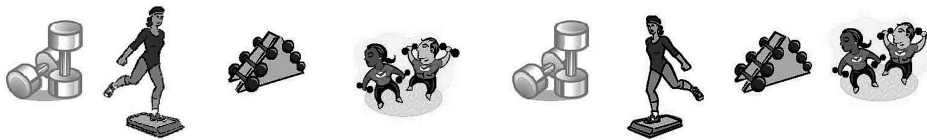
