Pre-registration Open for Old School Classic Car Show at Cultural Center

Owners of classic cars from the 1990s and earlier are invited to pre-register now to participate in the Lincoln City Cultural Center's Old School Classic Car Show on Aug. 23.

Proceeds will benefit children's programming at the Cultural Center. The event will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the front lawn of the center at 540 NE Highway 101.

The Cultural Center is located in the old DeLake Elementary School, which held its last regular classes in June 2000. The school was built in stages, beginning in the 1920s and finishing with the addition of the auditorium in the 1950s.

"We're excited to be the venue for Lincoln City's only summer car show and hope to make it an annual event," said Niki Price, executive director of the Cultural Center. "The historic DeLake school provides the perfect backdrop for classic cars."

Three awards – Mayor's Choice, People's Choice and Sponsor's Choice – and several door prizes will be given. The first 50 registrants will receive an attractive dash plaque with the event logo. A 50/50 raffle will be held with half of the proceeds going toward children's programs.

The local "oldies" radio station, KBCH, will conduct a remote broadcast from the site of the car show, interviewing participants, broadcasting the winning entries and playing music appropriate for the event.

In addition, the center is located within easy walking distance of the popular D River Wayside as well as shopping and restaurants.

Food vendors include Strung Out on Beads and Coffee, Kettlekorn and the Backpack Program burgers and dogs. Vendors and sponsors include Lincoln City Les Schwab, Lincoln Auto Supply and Gerber Tire Service.

Registration and check-in begin at 8:30 a.m. Pre-registration is advised. To register, call the Cultural Center at 541-994-9994 or stop in between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. any day except Tuesday, when the center is closed.

Dash into Summer with Oregon Coast Aquarium's Flippers, Feathers and Fins 5K

The Oregon Coast Aquarium invites runners and walkers of all ages to flock to Newport for the Flippers, Feathers and Fins 5K on May 17 at 8 a.m.

The aquarium organized the Flippers, Feathers and Fins 5K to promote healthy living on the Oregon Coast. All race proceeds benefit the animal care and marine science education programs at the aquarium.

Starting off at the aquarium, the scenic route winds along the Yaquina Bay estuary where racers will be greeted with facts about native wild-

life along the way before finishing back at the aquarium.

The 5K is open to runners and walkers age 12 and older. Strollers are allowed but the course has uneven ground with some gravel.

New for 2014 is the Kids Dash. This new closed-course race is perfect for aspiring little athletes age 2 to 9. Parents are invited to accompany their children on this 1K run through the aquarium grounds.

Flippers, Feathers and Fins 5K and Kids Dash participants will receive an official event shirt, post-

race refreshments and free admission to the aquarium for the day. Cost is \$25 for the 5K and \$15 for the Kids Dash. Early registration for the event ends May 10.

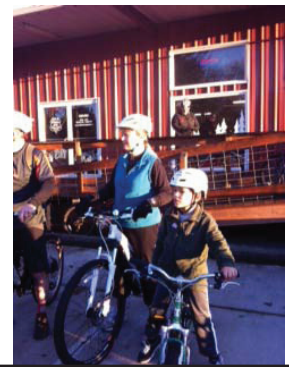
