<u>HOURS OF OPERATION</u>: Our office hours are Monday through Friday 8:00am – 4:30pm. We are closed on Federal holidays and Tribal holidays. We do ask that you try to make it into the office in plenty of time to conduct any business you have by close of business.

PRINTING, COPYING & FAXING: Community Members can send or receive faxes, have copies made and print documents. The charge is 5 cents per page. Note: If the documents are specifically requested by a Tribal Program there will not be a charge. (Non Siletz Tribal members will be charged for all faxing, printing and copying.)



The position of the Tribe on coming into Tribal Offices under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol is that it will NOT be tolerated. That also includes threats of any kind and/or unruly behavior. If you exhibit any of this type of behavior, you will be asked to leave.

<u>IMPORTANT REMINDER</u>: We are not allowed to accept collect phone calls! If you place a call like that it will be declined. You must call the 800 number in Siletz and asked to be transferred to this office.



ADDRESS UPDATES FOR PER CAPITA CHECKS

The last day to get your address updated in time for your per capita check to be mailed to a new address is by the close of business July 15th. Any address after that date will affect the mailing of per capita checks, causing a delay in receiving it. Please see the information below about address changes. For the full policy regarding per capita checks, please see the Tribal Member Distribution Ordinance on the tribal website www.ctsi.nsn.us.

ADDRESS CHANGES

If you have recently moved, even if you have a forwarding address on file with the post office, please get your Address & Contact Information Update form as soon as possible. You can get the form on the tribal website, from any area office or contact Enrollment to have one mailed to you.

Please note: "General Delivery" will no longer be acceptable as a mailing address as it is only temporary and the post office will only hold mail for a limited time for delivery. We have had a large amount of "General Delivery" mail returned and this is not effective in getting mail to tribal members when we need to. It is much better to rent a post office box if you are not able to use a permanent address somewhere else. If this is a concern for you or someone on the Missing Moccasins List, call Enrollment and we will work with them to figure out a permanent address solution.

MISSING MOCCASINS DO NOT RECEIVE THEIR PER CAPITA CHECKS ON TIME!

Please check the Missing Moccasin List. If you know anyone on that list please let them know they must provide Enrollment with a valid address by the deadline. Are you a parent of a minor tribal child (or know one) who has not received a recent statement for their Minor Trust Account? It could be that your child is a missing moccasin. You also need to submit an address update.

OVER INCOME GRANT

To provide housing repair assistance to Siletz tribal members whose household income exceeds the eligibility requirements for other tribal housing rehabilitation programs. Grants shall not exceed \$5000.00 and eligible applicants are limited to one grant per person/address/household. This program may be used anywhere in the United States of America and is based on availability. Ten (10) grants are awarded annually, depending on funding availability. Applications are available during the months of June and July and the lottery drawing will be held in August at a Tribal Council meeting.



Tribal Youth And Education Employment "TYEE" Program

Siletz Tribal youth ages 14-17 are invited to apply for the TYEE Program. Applications will be mailed to all Tribal youth in the 14-17 age range. If your youth does not receive an application, please call me at 503-390-9494 so I can get one to you. This is an opportunity to gain practical work experience over the summer. Deadline to apply is June 22, 2016. The first day for youth to work will be July 5th or later depending on placement.

Siletz Tribal Youth Activity Fund

Helps to fund programs for Siletz tribal youth in the many areas such as: sports, music, camp fees, lab fees, shop supplies, graduation, educational /scholastic materials, cultural supplies and materials, correspondence courses, and extra-curricular supplies. Siletz Tribal members from kindergarten to high school can access up to \$75.00.

HIGHER EDUCATION/ADULT VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

The next term we will be funding will be Fall Term 2016. The deadline for Fall Term is June 30, 2016. All documentation has to be turned in by that date to have your application considered complete. To be eligible to receive Tribal education funding you had to have completed your FASFA by January 31, 2016. Apply Now for Siletz Tribal Head Start's 2016 – 2017 School Year

It's time to apply for your child to attend the Siletz Tribal Head Start program for our upcoming 2016 – 2017 school year. If your child will be 3 or 4 years of age as of September 1, 2016, they are eligible to enroll in the Siletz Tribal Head Start Program. Call us at 1-800-922-1399 and ask for Head Start to request an application.

There are new enrollment requirements that all Head Start Programs must meet. All Head Start Programs are now required to conduct either a face-to-face or telephone interview with all applicants to verify the information on their child's application. So, when you return your application, we will be calling to verify the information with you.

This new requirement must be met before we can select your child for enrollment into our program. If we are unable to reach you, we will leave a detailed message asking you to call us back. Please call us back as soon as possible so we can finish processing your child's enrollment application. This is a mandatory requirement we must meet and we are unable to enroll any child until we complete this verification process.

The Siletz Tribal Vocational Rehabilitation program (STVRP) is here to assist members of any federally recognized Tribe (living within the Tribes service area) Siletz with overcoming impediments employment. We work with a diverse population of individuals who have disabilities ranging from cognitive impairments to physical limitations.

If you have a documented disability that creates limitations or prevents you from doing the work you desire or are qualified for we would like to assist you. We can assist with obtaining and maintaining employment and developing skills. We focus on motivation, identifying your abilities, skills that lead to successful employment and the development of self advocacy.

You should have a strong desire to work and be willing to work collaboratively with STVRP staff to provide you with the services needed to overcome your disability. Your personal goal should be self sufficiency and to live a healthy sustainable lifestyle.

The STVRP also assists transitioning students with disabilities. The ideal age for a student to start working with VR is two to three years before graduation, until the age 22, or graduated from high school. Our program can provide vocational guidance and counseling; with assist identification goals; employment employment retention; and advocacy within the academic environment. Students with a documented disability or who are on an "Individualized Education Plan-IEP" or on a "504 Plan" are encouraged to participate in the STVRP. Examples of SERVICES PROVIDED by STVRP:

- Guidance and Counseling
- Referral to Services
- Employment Services
- Portfolio Building, Resume Writing, Interviewing Techniques, Job Coaching
- Culturally Relevant Individualized Services
- Evaluations and Assessments
- Training Placement Opportunities
- Adaptive Equipment

Want help getting a job? Do you have a diagnosed disability (IEP or 504)?

You could be eligible for STVRP services.

Steps in working with Siletz Tribal Vocational Rehabilitation Program:

Step 1: Establish contact with the STVRP Counselor assigned to your school and schedule a meeting. Your first meeting with a STVRP Counselor will be to gather information about you, your needs, and to discuss whether the STVRP fits for you.

If the program is for you.....

Step 2: Sign an application and a STVRP Counselor will determine whether or not you're eligible for services by talking with you about your needs, your disability, and what barriers you have as a result. They may also need to do some additional testing and will read through your school records.

Step 3: Once you're eligible, you'll meet with your STVRP Counselor to discuss your goals and plans for employment.

STVRP Counselors can provide guidance and counseling to students who need help determining their goals or plan for what they want after high school.

Step 4: You'll also work with your STVRP Counselor to discuss the impact of your barriers as you work to reach your employment goals and determine what services are necessary to help you reach your goals.


