## Who is eligible:

- ◇ Enrolled members of Federally recognized tribes or descendants
- ◇ Live in the 11-county service area
- ◇ Meet income or employment requirements



## Program Process:

Request an application by assigned office.  
Complete application process (provide all required documentation and case plan)  
Program eligibility determination will be made  
Placement into a program component or referral to community partners will be made.

## Components:

### For Siletz Tribal Members:

- **Emergency Assistance-** Intended to be a One-time service to address emergent situations or basic needs
- **Pre-TANF-** Non-recurrent short-term benefits (not to exceed 4 month) to meet basic needs for families
- **General Assistance for Single Adults (GASA)-** Cash payment for eligible single adults to assist with basic needs
- **Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)-** Cash payment for eligible tribal member families to assist with basic needs
- **Non-Needy Caretaker Relative—** Cash grant to eligible caretaker relatives of Siletz children. Grant assistance for over-income households.
- **Diverted Services—** Support services to maintain employment.
- **Home Visiting —** Provides parenting and life skills for successful and positive parenting.

### For Federally Recognized Tribal members and descendants:

- **Classroom Training:** Assistance with GED, higher education, vocational training or certification.
- **Work Experience:** Paid training to gain real world work experience / employment references.
- **On-the-Job Training:** Employer incentive based program.
- **Direct Placement:** If hired by an employer and need supportive services to become job ready.
- **Core Services:** Provides employment enhancement services to clients.
- **Supplemental Youth Services:** Summer employment or educational services to youth 14-24.

\*\* Please note that all components of the 477 Self Sufficiency Program are on a budgetary basis.
