County to reappraise residential properties in Siletz, Toledo

The Lincoln County Assessor's Office will conduct a physical reappraisal of all residential properties within the cities of Toledo and Siletz.

County appraisers will drive marked vehicles and carry Assessor's Office identification. Physical reappraisals are routinely conducted to update the Lincoln County assessment records and maintain equitable assessments.

The reappraised values in Toledo and Siletz will be reflected on the 2015-16 tax roll that will be mailed in late October 2015.

Appraisal and assessment questions can be directed to the appraisal staff or the chief appraiser at 541-265-4102.

The assessor's counter is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to noon and 1-5 p.m.

The computer terminal access in the second floor hallway outside the assessor's office also is available Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

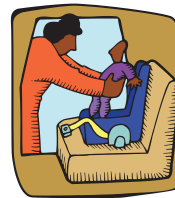
Car Seat Checkup Event
