AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM (ACP)

The ACP is a benefit program that helps households afford broadband internet at home. Qualifying households will receive \$30 off their monthly internet bill each month and \$75 each month on their bill if the household is on qualified tribal land.

This is a locked in benefit for a year after approval!

QUALIFYING APPLICANTS ARE THOSE WHO RECEIVE ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:



STATE-BASED BENEFITS/ASSISTANCE

Such as Medicaid, SNAP, WIC, Lifeline, etc.



FEDERAL BENEFITS/ASSISTANCE

Such as TANF, GA, USDA, Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA), SSI, Veterans pension or survivors benefits, Federal Pell grant, or has a child/ren in the home that goes to public school and receives free-reduced school lunches.

LIVING ON TRIBAL LANDS



Participates in one of these assistance programs **and** lives on qualifying Tribal lands: Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance,

Tribal TANF, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or Tribal Head Start (income based)

This is not an income based benefit. If none of these benefits apply to you or your household, you can then qualify under income. A household is eligible for the ACP if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.




